The PE and Sport premium has helped to achieve the School’s PE and Sport mission statement: At West Coker we believe that P.E plays a vital role in providing our pupils with a lifelong, positive and healthy relationship with sport and fitness. All children receive P.E lessons every week, which is delivered through a wide range of engaging and inclusive themes, such as: School Olympics and Beat the Teacher. Additionally, children will have the opportunities to explore and engage with the wide range of sporting equipment we have here at West Coker such as: curling, boccia, football, athletics and netball.

Unfortunately, due to the second national Covid 19 lockdown in the first half of the Spring Term, various planned activities had to be cancelled and some areas of the P.E curriculum were unable to be taught.

Curriculum Swimming

For the 2019-2020 academic year, we are required to publish how many pupils within our Year 6 cohort are meeting the national curriculum requirement to swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres, using a range of strokes effectively and perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations.

Unfortunately, this data was unable to be collected for this academic year (due to Covid 19) so we are unable to provide a report.
