The PE and Sport premium has helped to achieve the School’s PE and Sport mission statement: At West Coker we believe that P.E plays a vital role in providing our pupils with a lifelong, positive and healthy relationship with sport and fitness. All children receive P.E lessons every week, which is delivered through a wide range of engaging and inclusive themes, such as: School Olympics and Beat the Teacher. Additionally, children will have the opportunities to explore and engage with the wide range of sporting equipment we have here at West Coker such as: archery, curling, boccia, vaulting, football, athletics, netball, basketball and dodgeball. Children will also be provided with the opportunity to participate in swimming. All pupils also have the opportunity to participate in extra-curricular activities throughout the year, which allows them additional opportunities to utilise our equipment and facilities as well as participate in sports they may not have played before, including: quidditch, bench-ball, bench-football, futsal and handball.

Curriculum Swimming

For the 2019-2020 academic year, we are required to publish how many pupils within our Year 6 cohort are meeting the national curriculum requirement to swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres, using a range of strokes effectively and perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations.
